A large investment was made purchasing a vast selection of high quality books so that all children have access to a wide range of books suitable for their reading ability, to read at home.

We ask that parent / carers hear their child read at least 5 times a week and record this each time in their reading record. This includes both hearing their child read, but also asking questions about what



they have read e.g. how is the character feeling? What do you think the setting looks like? What clues helped you decide this? If you were to re-write this text, what would you change? Why?

If we have a positive case of COVID in school



HOW TO WEAR A MEDICAL MASK SAFELY

Do's -



Wash your hands before touching the mask



Inspect the mask for tears or holes



Find the top side, where the metal piece or stiff edge is



Ensure the colored-side faces



Place the metal piece or stiff edge over your nose



Cover your mouth, nose,



Adjust the mask to your face without leaving gaps on the sides



Avoid touching the mask



Remove the mask from behind the ears or head



Keep the mask away from you and surfaces while removing it



Discard the mask immediately after use preferably into a closed bin



Wash your hands after discarding the mask

Don'ts →



Do not Use a ripped or damp mask



Do not wear the mask only over mouth or nose



Do not wear a loose



Do not touch the front of the mask



Do not remove the mask to talk to someone or do other things that would require touching the mask



Do not leave your used mask within the reach of others



Do not re-use the

Remember that masks alone cannot protect you from COVID-19. Maintain at least 1 metre distance from others and wash your hands frequently and thoroughly, even while wearing a mask.
