The Year 3 children took part in their first of a terms worth of lessons, delivered in partnership with Greggs and Premiership Rugby (sponsored by Northampton Saints). In their first lesson on Thursday they learnt how to play tag rugby and about healthy eating. They were split into two groups so that one group went and did the practical session first whilst the others did the inside learning.

The practical session outside consisted of a rugby based warm up game, similar to stuck in the mud, where 6 children were given a rugby ball and had to tag people with it. After that, the children were shown how to put a tag rugby belt on and played a game which encouraged taggers to pull the rugby tag off of other children's belts when chasing them. If a child had their tag pulled off, they then became a tagger too. To wrap up the outdoor session, they were shown how to neatly roll up and put away a rugby tag.



The indoor session was about tackling health. This was all about the 5 different food groups, carbohydrates, protein, fats, dairy and fruit & vegetables. The children wrote on whiteboards which foods they liked and disliked. For example, a photo of potatoes was shown to the class and



the children wrote or drew this food on their whiteboard in the column of a food they like or if it was a food they disliked. Progressing from this, they learnt what group that food belonged to and what it does for their body. Again, using the example of the potato they learnt that it is a carbohydrate and that this will provide them with energy.

#### **Operation SNAP**

Operation Snap has been set up to help keep our county's roads as safe as possible.

It allows members of the public to report driving offences in the Northamptonshire area by filling out a form and uploading video evidence they have captured. For more

Submitted footage and reports are then examined by roads policing officers and can be used to take action against drivers found to be breaking the law.
