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News from FS2



This term we have been focusing on Growing. We learnt all about the Plant Life Cycle, using the Eric Carle story 'The Tiny Seed'. We spoke about and decided that seeds need water, sunlight and soil to grow. We planted our own Sunflower Seeds and watching them grow so far has been magical. We had fun making flowers and role-playing in our very own Exeter Garden Centre! We then investigated a strange vegetable called a turnip. We read the story 'The Enormous Turnip' and had so much fun retelling it through actions. At the end of the Story the Farmer's wife makes a delicious turnip soup. We made our own soup and tried it at snack time. Some of the children thought it was yummy but some of the

children thought it was yucky. But we all had fun trying it. We spent a long time exploring different fruits and vegetables, slicing and chopping them. We compared the seeds we found and decided to plant them too to see what could grow. This week we have been reading 'The Weaver' all about Stanley the Spider. We went on a hunt outside with our magnifying glasses to see if we could find our own spider friend!

News from Year 3

So far this term, Year Three have busy learning lots of facts, skills and vocabulary.

In science we have begun learning about the human body, specifically about the skeleton and muscles. The children took part in an investigation to find out things such as *Do children have smaller heads than adults? Do all children have the same size femur?* They had great fun measuring each other and recording their findings.

Within maths we have been working hard to recap our learning about addition and subtraction, using various resources such as Base 10 and place value counters and grids. The children are very good at drawing these

representations in their books too and using them to solve calculations and problems.

In English we have been learning to write a balanced

argument about whether a girl, from the story 'Bee & Me', should kill the bee she has trapped. We came up with various ideas about why she should and should not kill it and now they are writing their own balanced argument about whether she should free the bee instead.



In history we have been learning about James Lind who found out that sailors who were suffering from scurvy were actually lacking in vitamin C (although at the time he didn't know it was vitamin C, just that they needed to eat more citrus fruits).

We have been running a battle each week on TT Rock Stars between each class. Sharman class have won this three weeks in a row! Well done!

We have been fortunate enough to welcome the Saints, in partnership with Greggs Tackling Health for one of our PE sessions. The children are thoroughly enjoying this experience and learning about what makes a balanced diet and healthy life-style choices too.
