RSE Consultation – June 2021

Here at Exeter a Learning Community we always aim to promote our children's wellbeing and life skills and ensure that we give them the knowledge they need to be safe, and lead successful, healthy lives. Our commitment is to teach a comprehensive PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic) curriculum across all year groups.

In September 2020, the Department for Education made the teaching of Relationships, Sex Education and Health Education (RSE) compulsory in all schools. At a primary level the focus will be on relationships and health, introducing sex education in Years 5 and 6.

We will be implementing a new PSHE curriculum, which incorporates this new content, across the school. This content will be taught in a developmental and age appropriate way.

The DfE guidance states that we must share our curriculum with you.

How will this affect my child?

The new guidance focuses on healthy relationships and keeping children safe in the modern world. It also covers a wide range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing, safeguarding and healthy relationships.

Learning about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up, it will give young people the information, skills and positive values to have safe, healthy relationships and stay safe in the modern world.
