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#### **Make Music Day**



Make Music day is an international day for celebrating and making music.

This day gave everyone the opportunity to explore music and make music in creative ways. The children have really enjoyed exploring music and having the chance to perform and share what they had done in the virtual assemblies.

Nursery, EYFS and Key Stage One had the theme of "Music outdoors" and came up with some very creative ways to celebrate this. Key Stage Two's theme was "Music around the world"; it was brilliant to see the range of places and styles of music that the children learnt about.

In <u>Nursery</u> we had great fun exploring how to make our own instruments. We painted, stuck, cut and filled, and then we shook, hit, banged and jiggled. What fun it was trying to make our sounds as LOUD, and as quiet as we could. We sung our favourite songs and played our instruments along to the rhythm. We are music makers!

In <u>Foundation Stage 2</u> we had great fun making music outside. We used everyday objects to create music and enjoyed exploring the sound they created. We imitated rhythms that we were familiar with experimenting the different pitch and tone we could make on different materials.

<u>Year One</u> children had a fantastic time exploring natural sounds outside. They listened to the sea and from there we used percussion instruments and their own bodies to imitate the sounds of the sea. We made rain makers and filled them with natural materials, the children had great fun using these to create sounds.

<u>Year Two</u> children had an unexpected bubble closure last week, so their music day challenge became a double challenge, as the children had to find resources at home to design and make a musical instrument. After a live briefing on Microsoft Teams, the children spent the afternoon creating their masterpieces! The children created a variety of instruments including rain sticks, drums and guitars. We received photographs and videos of the children's work which was incredibly creative. Well done Year Two and thank you to everyone for helping us continue teaching the full curriculum remotely during this entire week



The children in <u>Year Three</u> learned about Bollywood music; how the songs are mainly sung in Urdu and Hindu, but more recently they are sung in Hinglish (a mixture of Hindu and English)! They took part in dancing and made up their own dance routines. They also decorated the traditional instrument of India, a sitar,



and then created their own art work, inspired by the Bollywood music.



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In <u>Year Five</u> Rose, we learned about digeridoos, which are woodwind and percussion instruments played by the Aboriginal People of Australia. The children watched several videos of digeridoos being played, before they got to make and decorate their own digeridoos. They were quite interested in how the digeridoo could be used to make animal sounds and commented that the 'music' made by digeridoos is not very 'pretty'.



In Year Five Ashworth, we listened to Mexican Mariachi music. We discussed the instruments we could hear and concluded that the main instruments in Mexican Mariachi music were guitars, trumpets and violins. We then all created a small piece of artwork to show how the music made us feel, using colours and patterns to represent this. We then pieced them all together into the shape of a guitar!

<u>Year Six</u> have been busy learning the songs from the musical Aladdin for their end of year production. We enjoyed giving the rest of the school a sneak preview of some of our favourite songs.

<u>Potter class</u> learned about African music. We listened to different types of music from different parts of Africa – some made us get up and dance! When we listened to them we discussed what instruments they were and how the music made us feel. We were introduced to different African instruments, one of them being the Djembe drum.

Most of the music in Africa includes drumming. We watched video tutorials for African djembe drumming and we learnt lots of repeating rhythms that are used in African music. This took a lot of concentration to keep in time with each other!
