Attendance Focus on Persistent Absentees

At Exeter A Learning Community we are committed to raising the attainment of the pupils at our school. To ensure all pupils achieve their potential it is vital that they attend school daily.





The Government classifies any pupil whose attendance drops below 90% as a Persistent Absentee. Parents are legally responsible for ensuring that their child attends school regularly. If your child's attendance drops below 96% their reasons for missed sessions are reviewed by the school attendance officer who will take appropriate action. Actions may include a letter or call, a parent contract meeting or a referral to the Local Authority. The Local Authority may issue a fixed penalty fine. Fines are charged per child and per parent. If a fine is not paid or attendance continues to decline then the Local Authority may take parents to court for prosecution.

If your child is absent for 5 days in a period of 6 weeks without medical evidence then the school will refer to the Local Authority.

<u>Year 1:</u> we have been learning more exciting things linked to our topic, the children have been learning about everyday superheroes and drew who is their superheroes. They have discussed what superpowers they have and why they are important to them. Within PSHE the children have being learning about how to keep themselves safe online with strangers and they were introduced to 'Clever' the robot.

In Science they have learnt about their 5 senses and went on a sense's workaround school. In Design and Technology, the children designed their own Superhero car on paper and on the computer.



In English, the children have been working on the text 'Superkid' and learning all the exciting adventures Superkid goes on. They have been working very hard on applying their phonics knowledge to their writing. Maths has been very hands on learning to add one more and one less and to compare amounts.

<u>Year 3:</u> have been investigating predators, learning about climate zones around the world and which continent predators live in. We are very excited to have a visit from Raptorxotics next Monday 11th October, where we will get up close and personal with real life predators - birds of

Year 4: have been learning how to investigate the effects of different drinks on a tooth-like substance. We have placed individual eggs into beakers containing a range of different liquids, including fruit juice, full sugar and sugar free fizzy drinks, milk and water. The children have developed investigative skills by carefully observing what happens over the course of the week, comparing the eggs in the different liquids and recording their findings.
