
paramedic who came to talk to us about emergencies and keeping safe.

The children really enjoyed the visit and it brought to life the things we have been talking about in class – we would also like to thank Mr Crawford for taking the time to come and visit us on his day off!







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Year 3 Visit



Last week, Year 3 enjoyed an exciting visit from RaptorXotics. They were very lucky to meet and greet lots of exciting predators, including a falcon, kestrel and owl. Some of them flew very closely over the children's head, which made many of the children duck! The children also got to pet 'Neon' the rat. They learnt about the role of a predator and their role within the food chain.





<u>Harvest</u>

On Wednesday 7th October we were lucky to have local vicar Paul Frost and Sam Brailsford (Children and family worker) visit school to talk about harvest. Hot dinners in school

We have noticed an increase in children not eating their hot dinners as they say they do not like the option which has been chosen for them. Can we please encourage parents to sit with your child when choosing their meals for the following week, so that you know they will enjoy what they are eating. Thank you.

Attendance

Can we please remind all parents that you must make contact with school to report your child/ren absent each day that the child is not in school. This includes when a child is isolating awaiting a PCR test result. Once the child's result have returned, please contact the school office to let us know, and ideally send the email confirmation to info@exeteralc.com. If positive and we have received confirmation of the isolation period, we will not expected you to report your child absent each day from that point (up to the end of their isolation period).

If you have a positive case in your household, all other members will still be expected to attend school every day, as long as they are not showing symptoms. If they are, they will need a PCR test. The majority of tests results are back within 24 hours (some as soon as 12 hours).

<u>Have your contact details changed?</u> Please ensure that the school office has correct contact numbers for you and your family to be able to contact you in case of your emergency.
