Junior Leadership Team

In school, we are forming a Junior Leadership Team to help and support our Senior Leadership Team in making the important decisions around the school. Last week, Mr Nicholls presented to the children what we wanted to achieve and this involved them creating their marketing campaign to secure votes for them to be the JLT member. On Friday 26th November (today), each class have voted for the person they would like to see represent their class on the JLT. This really enhances our children's understanding of the British Value of democracy. From then, we will have a Junior Leadership Team to direct how we do things in school; children have a voice of what events take place and take a real ownership over their school. Updates from year groups

<u>Nursery:</u> Last week we celebrated World Nursery Rhyme Week. Each day we set up an exciting invitation-to-play based on the nursery rhyme of the day. There was lots of counting as children added legs to their Incy Wincy Spiders. Children measured and named the parts of their bodies as we sang Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes. We boogied on Down In The Jungle as we washed the animals' clothes and we developed our gross-motor skills as we Wound the Bobbin Up and bounced like Sleeping Bunnies.









<u>FS2:</u> Following on with our interest in owls, FS2 have been learning about the story 'Owl Babies'. We used our noticing lens to describe what the baby owls looked like. We also had a big discussion about how the baby owls would be feeling, when they were all alone in the forest at night.

This week we continued to explore what happens at night-time, in the story "Can't You Sleep Little Bear?". We made some fantastic predictions of why Little Bear can't sleep and thought very carefully about what could be keeping him awake.

In maths, we have been having lots of discussions about the different things we do during the day and night. We've also used everyday language to talk about our daily routines and compare them with our friends.



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Year 1: Over the past two weeks have been looking at different materials for astronauts costumes. We took this further to then see which materials would float and sink they enjoyed using their investigate skills. In History we have been learning about Neil Armstrong and Helen Sharman. In Geography they have been learning about physical features and drew what they



understood to be a feature on their whiteboards and they have been applying their phonics. Brilliant work Year 1!

<u>Year 2:</u> Over the past few weeks in Year 2 we have been so busy. The children have had so much fun working within their 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' topic by exploring different foods and how to prepare them. In addition to this, in science we have been designing our own experiment looking into the best way to melt chocolate. The children are so excited to carry out this experiment next week and compare their results. Finally, the children kicked off their new English topic with an experience session exploring gingerbread men ready for writing their instructions next week. Well done year 2!



<u>Year 5:</u> In Year 5 over the past couple of weeks we have been learning to code during our computing lessons. This week we were making sets of traffic lights change colour and then cars move across the screen
