## **Christmas Dinners**



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#### <u>Homework</u>

Last month we sent out a letter explaining our homework expectation for children at Exeter.

- 1. Children should have the opportunity to read at home every day, and as often to an adult as possible. It is proven that the more fluent a child is at reading in primary school, the better their career chances are once they enter adulthood. Please record each time your child reads in their purple reading record.
- 2. Maths We are asking that children complete at least 30 minutes a week on Numbots / Timetables Rockstars, where they rehearse their number bonds and timestables facts. By the end of Year 4 it is a national expectation (which the children are tested on) to know all their timetables up to 12x12 fluently. We recommend 5 minutes a day rather than one 30 minute session, as little and often has a far greater impact of committing learning to their long term memory.
