Physical features - These are things that have been made by nature.



Map – A specially drawn picture of a place from above



Symbol- A picture that represents a word or group of words. They are used on maps to make things clear and easy to find.



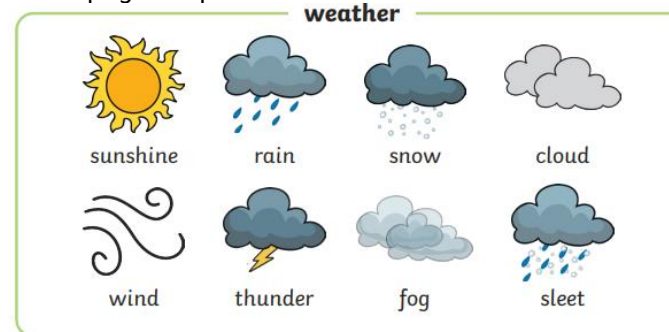

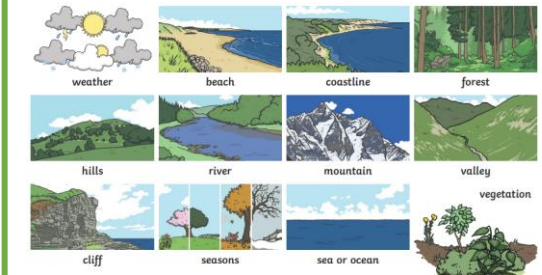

Physical features -

These are things that have been made by nature.



Human features-

These are things that have been made by humans.



Natural and Man-made

Natural materials are materials found in nature such as animals, plants or rock

Positional language included behind, next to and in front of. Directional language includes left, right, straight ahead and turn.	
Natural materials are dug out of the ground, grown or taken from a living thing. Man-made materials are often made from natural materials but have been changed to have different properties.	
Physical features are naturally-created features of the Earth	
Weather is a physical process.	
There are four seasons in the UK: spring, summer, autumn and winter.	
Fieldwork includes going out in the environment to look, ask questions, take photographs, take measurements and collect samples	
A map is a picture or drawing of an area of land or sea that can show human and physical features. A key is used to show features on a map. A map has symbols to show where things are located
