Flower - the coloured part of the plant which has the seeds in it.



Blossom – flowers on a tree or bush

Roots – the part of a plant which is in the ground to suck water from the soil



Petals – part of a flower which can be bright colours



Environment – the place that something grows or lives

Soil - the top layer of earth that plants grown in.

Nutrients – nourishment which is needed for life.

Deciduous Trees:

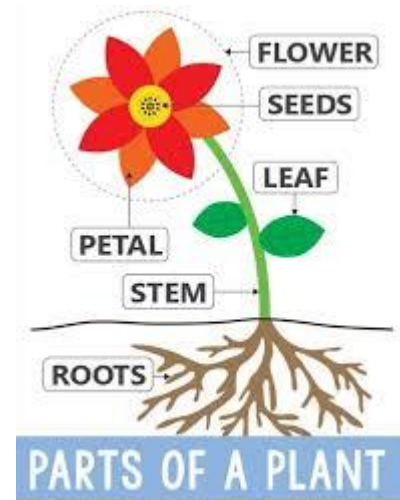
Deciduous trees lose their leaves in winter. Oak and maple trees are deciduous.

Trees are large, woody, plants.

As a scientist, the essential knowledge I need to answer the big question is:	Date
